



Alternative Plan Sample

Procedure Name: Give Me FIVE

Steps:

1. Sit in your seat
2. Face forward
3. Ignore distractions
4. Voices OFF
5. Eyes on your work

Reason(s): This procedure keeps you, and your classmates, SAFE!

Verbal Prompt: Teacher states, "Give me FIVE."

Non-Verbal Prompt: Teacher holds up an open hand (give me five).

Ideas for Practice:

- Role-play
 1. Pretend to help a struggling student with a problem, or take a phone call.
 2. Give students the verbal and non-verbal cue.
 3. After a few minutes, resume with the lesson.
 4. Praise the students who followed the procedure; re-teach to students who did not.
- Place the "Give Me FIVE" poster in your classroom.
